# 42<sup>ND</sup> EDITION AND 50<sup>TH</sup> ANNIVERSARY FOR A MARCIAGRANPARADISO DOMINATED BY THE NORDIQ CANADA SKI TEAM

You need to know different languages to congratulate the athletes on today's podiums at the Marcia. Most of the skiers who made it to the podium are from abroad. A great celebration took place on the Prati di Sant'Orso, also thanks to the sun, which managed to find its place in the sky despite the forecasts predicting otherwise.

As many as thirteen nations were represented, with nearly 400 participants at the 42nd edition of the MarciaGranParadiso. The "bisons" set off promptly at 10:00 from the Prati di Sant'Orso, eager to make the most of a day on narrow skis that will surely go down in history. On February 16, 1975, the story of this beautiful competition began to be written, and fifty years later, the emotions remain just as strong, vivid, and powerful.

From a purely sporting perspective, the starting line featured several notable athletes, including members of the Canadian national cross-country ski team: Antoine Cyr, Remi Dolet, Olivier Leveille, Pierre Grall-Johnson, and Olivia Nesbitt-Bouffard. Also present were French skier Maurice Manificat, the Carabinieri team members Tommaso Cuc, Lorenzo and Alessio Romano, and the local favorite, Cogne native Mikael Abram. Additionally, three-time Winter Triathlon world champion, Russian athlete Daria Rogozina, and Chiara Caminada—who has now also become a Cogne resident for work—were among the participants.

The race started at a fairly fast pace, despite the snow being anything but quick. Canadian skier Cyr took the lead right away, setting the pace for the first part of the race, aiming to thin out the group as quickly as possible over the 30-kilometer course. By the time the race reached Valnontey, a cooperative quartet had broken away, consisting of Cyr, Abram, Leveille, and Romano. Their strong push created a significant gap from the rest of the pack. Maurice Manificat, who had started at a steadier pace, followed behind, trying to maintain a consistent rhythm.

As the race continued towards Lillaz, Cyr made a decisive move, breaking away from the quartet and going solo. Behind him, the trio of Abram, Romano, and Leveille tried to keep up, while a second group, consisting of Pierre Grall-Johnson, Alessio Romano, Matteo Arlian, and Tommaso Cuc, started making up ground. Manificat, on the other hand, lost pace and dropped to ninth position, while Russian athlete Pavel Andreev fell even further behind.

Cyr was the first to cross the finish line, completing the race in one hour and eighteen minutes, securing victory with about a 30-second lead over Mikael Abram and 35 seconds over his teammate Olivier Leveille.

In the women's race, Olivia Bouffard-Nesbitt dominated the marathon, finishing in one hour and thirty-one minutes, with a lead of over five and a half minutes ahead of Russia's Daria Rogozina and more than nine minutes ahead of Chiara Caminada.

As in recent years, the event also featured races for the Allievi and Ragazzi categories on dedicated 5- and 8-kilometer courses.
